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# Launch of Let's Read in City of Yarra - VIC

Richmond Library hosted the launch of Let's Read in Yarra. Representatives from The Yarra Emergent Literacy and Learning Group (YELL) had been working together for 12 months to ensure the delivery of Let's Read to parents and children from the 3 housing estates and the surrounding areas. The aim of YELL is to ensure that all children are ready for school. We know that children from mainstream. middle socioeconomic status communities arrive at school with between 1200 and 1700 hours of one-to-one shared book reading and literacy development, while children from disadvantaged communities are exposed to less than 25 hours. Parents with a Health Care Card will have Let's *Read* delivered and be given the books when they visit their Maternal and Child Health Nurse. The Mayor, Councillor Jane Garrett, Councillor Dale Smedley and Heather Le Roy, GM, The Smith Family together with over 50 parents, children and representatives from many of the agencies and services in Yarra participated in the launch. The launch included story telling with all the children and at the end of this all guests were asked to choose a book

and read it to one of the many children in attendance. All children received the gift of a book as they left. The visiting MCHNs now take the *Let's Read* books with them and use them when reading to the children they are visiting. Commercial Eyes has generously funded this project for The Smith Family.

### Let's Read Community Event at Corrimal Library The Illawarra Let's Read - NSW

On Monday 29th November 2010 TSF along with lead agency Schools as Communities Centres (Farmborough Road and Albion Park Rail) facilitated a Let's Read Community Event hosted by Wollongong City Council library services at Corrimal library. Almost 100 parents along with over 200 children attended the event, outstanding given the poor weather conditions. They enjoyed participating in a range of literacy based activities including story time, puppet show, rhythm and rhyme, alphabet games and were also able to decorate and take home their own library bag filled with a range of treats including books, games and stationery items. The event was also well supported by a number of existing community partners and keen interest in *Let's Read* and further expansion of the program into the northern suburbs was demonstrated by a number of playgroups and preschools from the Corrimal community.

# Launchpad to Learning

The Smith Family, with support from Boeing, is piloting a new program, Launchpad to Learning, in three communities - Villawood/Fairfield (NSW), Ipswich (QLD) and Collingwood (VIC).

As part of this program The Smith Family is going to deliver three community based events in each area to promote early years literacy and the importance of a 'whole of community' approach to improving literacy for children aged 0-5 years so that they start school with the necessary skills to learn.

The first of these community events was held in Villawood on 26 November, 2010 as part of the Villawood Children's festival. The event showcased *Let's Read* and promoted the concept of a 'whole of community' approach to early year's literacy. On the day a number of services from the local community took part to provide families with information and storytelling, book reading and related craft activities.


Similarly the event in Ipswich was held on 9 December, 2010 in association with Ipswich Council and the Ipswich local library. Book reading and storytelling based on the theme of air travel engaged the children, and a morning tea allowed *Let's Read* trained facilitators and other service providers to interact with the families.

The Launchpad to Learning event in Collingwood was held as a celebration of books and early years literacy in the Christmas season. Santa and his helpers read to children and there were lot of related fun activities including book making and face painting. In all 1,200 books were distributed and 567 gifts were given out to the attending children.

Similar events will be held again in these communities in 2011.
