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Training

Richard Kaa has been very busy travelling to communities to train the community based professionals, preparing them to delivery the Let's Read program to parents on a one-to-one basis. There has now been 229 people trained to deliver Let's Read.

The training sessions always present a valuable opportunity for a wide range of people from the community to get together and learn more about how each other works with families.



Evaluation

When you had completed your agreement to deliver Let's Read you would have received a "Community Guide". This is a very detailed manual giving you information to support you to implement Let's Read.

Within the Let's Read "Community Guide" there is a section related to evaluation, and this supplies you with an extensive list of questions that you could utilise in your community to evaluate Let's Read.

Evaluation is an important part of implementing any program. We encourage you to take the time to look at this material and begin the process at the local level.

Expansion

When Let's Read was initially developed we were not in a position to fully explore the issues related to an early literacy program for the indigenous and culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) communities. We are now beginning the necessary work to identify the relevant research evidence and undertake community consultations to enable us to conceptualise and/or modify Let's Read to meet the needs of these audiences.

We will keep you informed as this next phase progresses.
